F **PLEASE NOTE:** All Permit to Practice applications are reviewed by the PEGNL Registration Committee. Please provide a detailed description and scope of the professional services that the Permit Holder (Company) intends to offer in or for the province of Newfoundland and Labrador, including fields of specialization and current projects.

G **Disciplines to be Covered by Permit.**

It is a requirement of PEGNL that its engineering and geoscience license holders only practice in areas or disciplines of engineering or geoscience for which they have the necessary academic training and experience.

The Committee will grant Permits to Practice to firms based on demonstration of current practical experience by the person accepting responsibility for the discipline (the PEGNL Member in Responsible Charge). Some engineering and geoscience license holders have, through a combination of continuing training and experience, acquired the additional skills needed to practice in an area or discipline other than that for which they were initially trained. The Registration Committee will consider that Permits covering these additional areas or disciplines be issued only upon full substantiation and documentation of the necessary training and experience.

H **PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY INSURANCE**

In accordance with the *Engineers and Geoscientists Act 2008*, section 12. (3), all permit

holders must carry professional liability insurance. Before a permit is granted, proof of the company's insurance coverage is required. ***Please attach a copy of your company's professional liability insurance certificate.*** By-Law No. 2 (available on www.pegnl.ca) prescribes the requirements for satisfactory proof of insurance. Minimum coverage is \$250,000 per claim and \$500,000 in the aggregate. Please refer to PEGNL's website for examples of insurance certificates that satisfy the requirements.

I **MEMBERS IN RESPONSIBLE CHARGE**

For each discipline of practice being requested, there must be a qualified PEGNL license holder to accept responsible charge. Each member in responsible charge undertakes to provide responsible direction and personal oversight to a specific discipline of the professional practice of the organization.

The Applicant must name at least one employee who is licensed with PEGNL who will serve as member in responsible charge for each discipline for which the permit is being requested.

List Members in Responsible Charge and indicate the discipline (from item G) for which they accept responsible charge.

*When a professional license holder accepts responsibility for more than one Permit or wishes to accept responsibility for a Permit while being an employee of another firm, the person will be required to provide information to the Registrar indicating how they will comply with the intent and definition of "responsible charge". **Further, a letter of consent to this arrangement is required from each Firm.***

It is required that all Professional Engineers and Geoscientists who use the permit to practice stamp to seal drawings and/or specification be listed in section "I." All Engineers and Geoscientists listed in section "I." and all other Engineers and Geoscientists practicing in Newfoundland and Labrador must be registered with PEGNL. If any such Engineer or

Geoscientist working with your firm is not registered with PEGNL, he/she must immediately apply for individual licensure.

Each member in responsible charge must complete the appended *Profile Form*, clearly indicating details of academic and experience qualifications within the discipline requested. Resumes will not be accepted in lieu of the Profile form, however resumes are requested to supplement the information provided.

- (b) To assume responsibility and designate specific signing authority within the organization for matters to be addressed by the Chief Executive Officer (or equivalent) or designate who signs the Application for Permit to Practice on behalf of the Permit Holder.
- (c) To surrender permit stamps and certificates to the Registrar in circumstances where there are not members or licensees of PEGNL assuming responsibility for the professional practice of the applicant.
- (d) To report on an annual basis the names of:
 - i. Chief Executive Officer (or equivalent) or designate taking corporate responsibility for the applicant.
 - ii. PEGNL members in responsible charge assuming responsibility for direction of the professional practice of the applicant.

Engineers and Geoscientists Regulations, 2011

under the

Engineers and Geoscientists Act, 2008

9. (2) To be eligible for registration as a permit holder, a partnership, limited partnership or other association of persons or corporation shall, in addition to other applicable requirements of the Act, the regulations and the by-laws,

- (a) make application for registration in accordance with section 3 including payment of required fees;
- (b) satisfy the registration committee that all aspects of the practice in each discipline of professional engineering or professional geoscience of the applicant are directly supervised by a professional member who is
 - (i) a professional member in responsible charge,
 - (ii) an employee of the partnership, limited partnership or other association of persons or corporation, and
 - (iii) currently registered and in professional good standing; and
- (c) provide proof to the registrar of professional liability insurance coverage in the form and amount prescribed and published by the board.

(3) The practice of professional engineering or geoscience of a permit holder shall be restricted to the discipline or disciplines specified in the permit.

Association to be kept informed

10. (1) A permit holder shall keep the registrar advised at all times of the names of professional members who are in responsible charge and shall immediately notify the registrar of changes, whether temporary, indefinite or permanent, in the status of a professional member in responsible charge for the permit holder.

(2) The professional member in responsible charge shall, on relinquishing that responsibility whether temporarily, indefinitely or permanently, immediately notify the registrar to that effect.
