Survey Background

This year the Professional Engineers and Geoscientists of Newfoundland and Labrador (PEGNL) and the Association of Professional Engineers and Geoscientists of New Brunswick (APEGNB) agreed to jointly complete a salary survey. Many members, employers, and those considering a career in geoscience have expressed an interest in obtaining current statistics on geoscience salaries in the Atlantic region. It has been three years since members were asked to participate in the last survey.


The 2024 salary survey was conducted and compiled by Truverus. The survey ran from July 2nd to July 26^{th.} This year 409 members were asked to participate in the survey, with 84 responding for a 20.5% participation rate. By association, response rates were 25.8% for APEGNB and 18.3% for PEGNL. The margin of error (MOE) for the survey overall was 3.4%. By association, the MOE was 7.8% for APEGNB, and 4.5% for PEGNL. In the interest of maintaining the integrity of data and protecting the anonymity of our respondents, we have made some adjustments to the presentation of our findings, including the omission of detailed tables due to insufficient response rates in certain categories and the suppression of some data points to safeguard the confidentiality of individual respondents

Only the aggregated data has been presented in this report. Individual members data will be kept confidential, and Truverus will not share that data with anyone. Data for groups under 5 has been suppressed within the report but is still included in the aggregate data.

The mean, median, lower, and upper quartiles were calculated using the midpoint of each of the salary ranges. Where the mean is the average, median is the 50th percentile, lower quartile is the 25th percentile and the upper quartile is the 75th percentile.






5 - Salary by Post-Graduate Studies Mean Salary


Mean Salary by Post-Graduate Degree




6 - Salary of Post-Graduate Degree (All Associations)

Mean Salary by Years of Experience as a Professional Geoscientist




9 - Salary by Years of Experience since Registration (Professional Geoscientists Mean Salary)





Salary by Sector of Employment






Vacation Time by Employment Sector




14 - Mean Annual Vacation Days by Employment Sector All Associations


